WE WELCOME OUR NEW PEACE OFFICERS

Twenty young men and women from Prince Albert, Leeu-Gamka and Klaarstroom recently completed their training in the Peace Officer and Traffic Warden Programme, funded by the Western Cape Department of Police Oversight and Community Safety, with the training offered by the City of Cape Town's Metro Police Academy. They received their certificates during a graduation ceremony at Hoërskool Zwartberg on 11 March 2025.

Among the guests were Minister of Police Oversight and Community Safety, Anroux Marais, Executive Mayor, Linda Jaquet, Deputy Mayor, Sidney Koonthea, Cllr Neville Claassen and a very proud community of family and friends.

"This initiative is a good example of what can be achieved when different spheres of government work together with a shared vision," said Mayor Jaquet. "We want to ensure that our residents live in a safe and well-governed environment where law and order are upheld, and where crime prevention is effective."

Mayor Jaquet expressed her gratitude to Minister Marais for the life-changing opportunity afforded these twenty young men and women and then addressed the group. "Today you take on a responsibility that goes beyond simply enforcing regulations. You are now role models, peacebuilders, and community champions. The uniform you wear signifies trust, and with that comes the expectation that you will serve with integrity, fairness, and compassion."



The group will all receive a full year of practical work experience to apply what they have learned and make a meaningful impact in the community's lives. The Mayor thanked the families of the graduates for their support and urged the residents in all three towns to continue supporting these young people now starting a new chapter in their lives.

Building on this community-centred approach, we are strengthening partnerships with existing law enforcement. We acknowledge the valuable work of Captain Carina Vosloo, who has been serving as Station Commander at SAPS Prince Albert for the past several months and are committed to building a strong working relationship with her team.

We recently held a productive meeting with Captain Vosloo and the new District Cluster Commander, Brigadier Francois de Wet, who joined via speaker phone. Prince Albert is known as a friendly and safe town—and we aim to enhance this reputation.

ESKOM

WHAT'S BEEN GOING ON WITH OUR POWER?

We continue to experience challenges with our electricity supply. Here is why, and what is being done to improve the situation. Our electrical supply comes from Eskom via a 130-kilometer line called Farmers Line 2, starting in Leeu Gamka. The "T" off along this line to PA is 50 kilometres from Leeu Gamka. This line powers over 30 users, including our town. The catch? If something goes wrong anywhere along this entire feeder, it can knock out power for everyone, including PA. Due to the rugged terrain along the route, identifying the cause of faults can be challenging and time consuming.

Failures within Eskom's area of responsibility

From 1 September 2024 to 12 February 2025, we had 14 Eskom outages, lasting anywhere from 10 seconds to nearly 6 hours. Here's what's been causing them:

- Environmental factors: Lightning strikes, fires, strong winds, etc.
- Vandalism and theft: Damage caused by criminal activities.
- Aging infrastructure: Worn-out equipment and structures.

Failures within the municipality's area of responsibility

Electricity supply failures under the municipality can be grouped into two categories:

- Short-duration faults: Caused by tree branches touching power lines during high winds or rain. These faults are typically resolved by re-energizing the relevant breakers. About 20 such trips occurred mainly in the South End over the last six months, primarily due to aging infrastructure, established trees touching power lines and weather
- Long-duration outages: These are outages requiring repairs, have occurred six times since October 2024. They lasted between 25 minutes and six hours and were caused by:
 - Planned maintenance shutdowns.
 - Damage to overhead cables from weather or birds.

Preventative maintenance recommendations

To minimise outages and improve reliability, Eskom is implementing the following measures:

- Enhanced security: Funding is required to install high-security fencing around critical equipment (reclosers* 5592 and 380) to deter vandalism
- Pole replacement: Eskom is requesting funds for a rock drilling truck to replace damaged poles along Leeu Gamka F3. This investment will stabilise the supply network.
- Recloser elevation: Efforts are ongoing to elevate reclosers* and control boxes to protect against theft and vandalism.

The Municipality is also in discussions with Eskom regarding the feasibility of an alternate supply line directly from Leeu Gamka to Prince Albert. This project has an estimated cost of R100 million, and deliberations are ongoing.

Our Local Efforts

- Tree Trimming: We're working on a deal to prune trees near power lines to stop those short outages. Fewer branches, fewer problems!

Future plans

- Prince Albert Municipality is exploring the possibility of establishing a solar plant to supplement Eskom's electrical supply.

Why Solar?

- Keep the lights on even during outages.
- Lower electricity costs for the municipality and its residents.
- Go greener by lowering our carbon footprint.

This is a big project that may take over two years. Here's what we need to do:

- Arrange Impact Studies (environmental, scenery, etc.)—this could take up to a year.
- Raise funds through grants or partnerships.
- Figure out the best way to make it work for everyone.
- Interface with Eskom, provincial, and national governments.

The municipality will provide regular updates on the progress of this project as well as engaging residents regularly.

* A recloser functions as a circuit breaker that can automatically reset itself after it has been tripped due to a fault on the power line. When a fault occurs (like a tree branch touching a power line or a lightning strike), the recloser temporarily interrupts power flow to prevent damage to the system. If the fault persists, the recloser will try again several times before remaining open until manually reset.



Toerisme-vergadering met Minister bring NUWE GELEENTHEDE

Op Vrydag, 28 Februarie 2025, het ons die voorreg gehad om die Wes-Kaapse minister van landbou, ekonomiese ontwikkeling en toerisme, Dr. Ivan Meyer, by ONS Langhuis vir 'n toerisme-vergadering te ontvang. Ons glo hierdie is 'n belangrike mylpaal vir ons munisipaliteit en dorp se toekoms.

Die vergadering het belanghebbendes van ons munisipaliteit se toerisme-sektor bymekaargebring en hulle het die geleentheid gehad om direk met die minister en sleutel provinsiale amptenare in gesprek te tree.

Die minister, sy departementshoof, Jo-ann Johnston, amptenare van Wesgro, ons raadslede en senior munisipale amptenare, sowel as lede van die Prins Albert toerismevereniging (PATA), die Prins Albert gemeenskapstrust (PACT), en verteenwoordigers van die toerismesektor van Prins Albert, Klaarstroom, en Leeu-Gamka het die geleentheid bygewoon.

Minister Meyer het opregte entoesiasme en toewyding tot ons streek se potensiaal getoon, en waardevolle insigte gebied oor provinsiale ondersteuning vir ons plaaslike toerisme-inisiatiewe. Sy bespreking het die belangrikheid van infrastruktuur-stabiliteit ingesluit, veral water- en elektrisiteitsekerheid, wat noodsaklik is vir die groei van Prins Albert se toerisme sektor.

Die minister se positiewe reaksie op die voorgestelde idees vir 'n hersiening van ons handelsmerk en bemarking, terwyl ons met belanghebbendes saamwerk om toerismeontwikkelingsgeleenthede wat geskik is vir ons Munisipaliteit te ondersoek is bemoedigend.

Die minister het Uitvoerende Burgemeester, Linda Jaquet, se versoek volstaan dat die program aangepas word om aanbiedings deur Ingrid Wolfaardt, voorsitter van PACT, Inga Terblanche, voorsitter van PATA, en Karin Henriques, 'n plaaslike bemarking- en handelsmerkskenner, in te sluit.

PATA se aanbieding is vooraf met die Raad bespreek om belyning met ons munisipale prioriteite en die provinsie se strategiese rigting te verseker, wat 'n betekenisvolle gesprek tussen die Minister en ons gemeenskap aangemoedig het.

Minister Meyer het sy ondersteuning vir ons visie vir toerisme uitgespreek en aangedui dat die Wes-Kaapse regering belangstel om saam met verskeie van die voorgestelde projekte te werk. Die bou van hierdie verhoudinge met die provinsiale regering en ander is noodsaklik vir ons munisipaliteit se ontwikkeling.

Burgemeester Jaquet het gesê die munisipaliteit bly verbind daartoe om nou saam te werk met belanghebbendes in die toerisme-sektor om ons gedeelde visie vir volhoubare toerisme-groei te implementeer wat alle gemeenskappe in ons gebied bevoordeel.



EXPANDING YOUNG MINDS

Reading aloud day

24 January was International Education Day, and 5 February celebrated World Read Aloud day. Reading aloud to children is indeed one of the best things we can do for their development and future academic success. Children with a bigger vocabulary understand what they read better, and also learn new information more easily. Young children whose parents read to them five times daily will hear nearly 1.5 million more words by the time they turn five than children whose parents or caregivers don't read to them, according to a study by The Ohio State University.

Prince Albert Municipal Library hosted a read aloud morning with Grade R-3 learners from Kweekvallei Kollege and Albert College on 6 February 2025 to celebrate the day and help instill a love of reading in our children.
