Western Cape Premier Alan Winde, Provincial Minister of Infrastructure Tertuis Simmers and Provincial Minister of Local Government, Environmental Affairs and Development Planning Anton Bredell visited the Prince Albert municipal area on 16 July 2026. Accompanied by municipal representatives, engineers and disaster management officials, the delegation inspected Meiringspoort and the Swartberg Pass and met with affected communities in Klaarstroom and Prince Albert.

The visit highlighted the extraordinary scale of the storm damage. Flood levels in Meiringspoort reached approximately twice the height recorded during the 1996 flood. All river crossings sustained damage, while four major sections of the road were completely washed away. More than 80 truckloads of debris had already been removed by the time of the visit. The Swartberg Pass was also damaged, but reopened in June following emergency work. The permanent restoration of Meiringspoort is expected to take at least two years and cost hundreds of millions of rand, as complex engineering, environmental and heritage requirements must be addressed.

The Western Cape Government is working towards a temporary solution that could allow Meiringspoort to reopen under strict access controls by December 2026, subject to favourable conditions. Support is also being provided through engineering expertise, infrastructure planning, disaster management coordination and temporary education arrangements for affected learners. Prince Albert Municipality will continue working with the relevant provincial departments to support residents, businesses and visitors, while ensuring that verified recovery updates are shared with communities.

Friends of the Swartberg Pass Initiative Takes Shape



A stakeholder meeting was held on 14 August 2026 to discuss the establishment of Friends of the Swartberg Pass. The proposed community-based organisation aims to support the protection, appreciation and sustainable management of the Swartberg Pass and its surrounding landscape. It will provide a platform through which government, civil society and the broader community can collaborate on conservation, heritage protection, responsible tourism, education, awareness and future projects. Western Cape Minister of Cultural Affairs and Sport, Ricardo Mackenzie, attended the meeting and expressed his support for the initiative.

Stakeholders from both the Prince Albert and Oudtshoorn sides of the Swartberg Pass demonstrated their commitment to working together to protect this important natural and cultural asset. An interim committee will now develop the organisation's vision, mission, objectives, constitution, membership principles and communication strategy, while also considering priorities such as road maintenance, heritage signage, road safety, youth development and visitor facilities. Prince Albert Municipality looks forward to seeing how this collaborative initiative evolves and contributes to preserving the Swartberg Pass for future generations.

Ons moedig alle inwoners aan om van die vier biblioteke in ons drie dorpe gebruik te maak en die wonderwêreld van lees te ontdek.



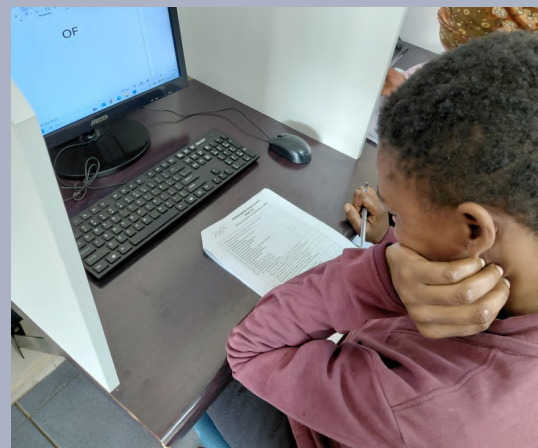

The three-day Milestones of Freedom programme concluded on 24 July 2026 with a community clean-up near Leeu-Gamka Primary School. Strengthening Local Economic Development

The assessment highlighted areas of strength and identified opportunities for further development. Its purpose was not to measure performance, but to establish a baseline for learning and continuous improvement. The findings will help guide targeted provincial support and capacity-building, strengthen stakeholder collaboration, and improve the Municipality's ability to monitor the outcomes and long-term impact of LED initiatives.



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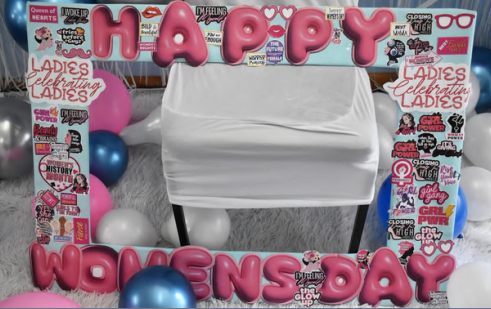
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Women's Month Celebration Brings Staff Together

Noodoefening toets gereedheid by Thusong-sentrum



Prins Albert Munisipaliteit se span vir beroepsgesondheid en -veiligheid het op 19 Augustus 2026 sy eerste noodoefening by die Prins Albert Thusong-sentrum uitgevoer. Die scenario het 'n elektriese kortsluiting nageboots wat 'n brand veroorsaak het. Omdat die sentrum op daardie stadium deur werknemers en talle gemeenskapslede gebruik is, het die oefening 'n waardevolle geleentheid gebied om die ontruimingsproses onder realistiese omstandighede te toets.

Wetstoepassing en Brandweerdienste het op die alarm gereageer, waarna die geboue ontruim en die beheerde brand geblus is. 'n Gesimuleerde pasiënt is ook as deel van die oefening behandel. Personeel van Binnelandse Sake, Maatskaplike Ontwikkeling, SASSA en die biblioteek het aan die ontruimingsproses deelgeneem. Hulle het die oefening verwelkom en met die Munisipaliteit saamgewerk om die veiligheid van personeel en gemeenskapslede te verseker.

Die oefening het reaksietye, samewerking tussen die betrokke spanne en gebougebruikers se kennis van die aangewese versamelpunt getoets. Die lesse wat hieruit geleer is, sal gebruik word om noodprosedures verder te verfyn en die Munisipaliteit se gereedheid vir werklike noodsituasies te versterk.



MKMO-Besigheid Ekspo in Klaarstroom

Die Mikro-, Klein- en Mediumondernemings (MKMO) besigheid ekspo is op 21 Julie 2026 by die Klaarstroom Thusongsatellietentrum aangebied. Die Wes-Kaapse Departement van Plaaslike Regering, insluitend die Thusong-uitreikprogram en Gemeenskapsontwikkelingswerkersprogram (ook bekend as CDW's), die Wes-Kaapse Departement van Landbou en die Agentskap vir Klein-Ondernemingsontwikkelings en -finansiering (ook bekend as SEDFA), en die Sektor-onderwys- en Opleidingsowerheid vir Media-, Inligting- en Kommunikasietegnologie (ook mesken as MICT SETA) het aan die program deelgeneem. Plaaslike besighede en ander belanghebbendes het ook die geleentheid bygewoon en aan gesprekke oor plaaslike ekonomiese ontwikkeling deelgeneem.

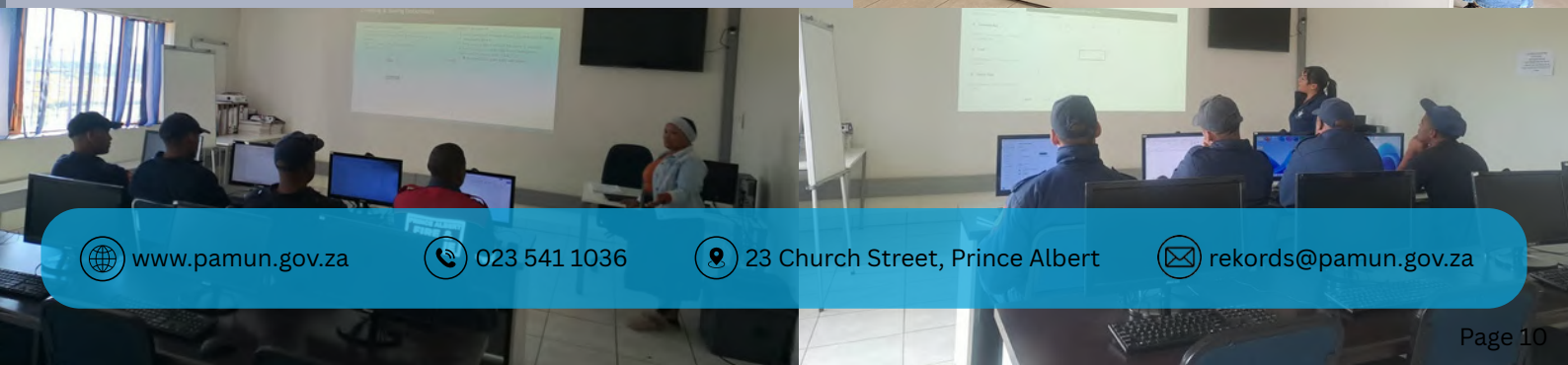
Die program het gefokus op besigheidsondersteuning, marktoegang, befondsingsgeleenthede, landbouverwerking en die rol van klein ondernemings in gemeenskapsontwikkeling. Entrepreneurs kan steeds by die Klaarstroom e-sentrum inligting bekom oor hoe om 'n onderneming te begin, aan die nodige vereistes te voldoen en besigheidsgereed te word. 'n Gids van organisasies en maatskappye wat ondersteuning aan ondernemings bied, is ook daar beskikbaar.



Personeelontwikkeling versterk Brandweerdienste

Lede van Prins Albert Munisipaliteit se Brandweerdienste het gedurende Augustus twee weke lange opleiding in Microsoft Word en Excel-sigblaai by die Prince Albert WCG eCentre voltooi. Die opleiding het hulle toegerus met waardevolle rekenaarvaardighede wat hulle in die uitvoering van hul daaglikse administratiewe pligte kan gebruik.

Personeelontwikkeling bevorder nie net nuwe vaardighede nie, maar bou ook selfvertroue en ondersteun persoonlike groei. Die Munisipaliteit bedank Petra en Marne van die eCentre vir die aanbieding van die opleiding en hul ondersteuning aan die span. Ons is trots op die brandweerspan se bereidwilligheid om voortdurend te leer en hul vaardighede verder te ontwikkel.





Tegniesgesproke

Diefstal van munisipale infrastruktuur bedreig die gemeenskap

'n Probleem wat van tyd tot tyd voorkom, het ongelukkig weer sy kop uitgesteek in die Prins Albert munisipale gebied. Ek verwys na die diefstal van mangatdeksels uit ons riool- en stormwaternetwerke.

Die probleem word verder aangehits deur mense en besighede wat herwinbare materiaal aankoop sonder om noodwendig seker te maak waar die materiaal vandaan kom. Vir ons as munisipaliteit is dit 'n groot probleem, aangesien die risiko's wat met hierdie tipe diefstal gepaardgaan, uiters ernstig is.

Wanneer 'n mangatdeksel gesteel word, word 'n gevaarlike situasie vir die gemeenskap geskep. Kinders kan naby die oop mangat speel en daarin val, met moontlik ernstige gevolge. Daarbenewens kan ons stormwater- en rioolnetwerke verstopt raak met allerlei afval wat mense daarin gooi wanneer die infrastruktuur oop en onbeskermd gelaat word.

'n Tipiese voorbeeld hiervan is in Buitekantstraat in Prins Albert, waar 'n rooster oor 'n stormwatersloot stuk vir stuk weggedra is. Die munisipaliteit het die dele van die rooster aan mekaar vasgesweis in 'n poging om dit moeiliker te maak vir diewe om dit te verwyder. Ten spyte hiervan is verskeie meters van die rooster steeds weggedra en vermoedelik vir herwinning verkoop. Dit skep 'n ernstige risiko vir ons gemeenskap en bedreig die behoorlike funksionering van die stormwaternetwerk. Dieselfde risiko geld vir riool- en ander munisipale infrastruktuurnetwerke.

Wat die diefstal van kables en elektriese toerusting betref, het die aantal voorvalle in Prins Albert tans afgeneem. Leeu-Gamka bly egter 'n hoërisikogebied wanneer dit by hierdie tipe diefstal kom.

Die koste verbonde aan die vervanging en herstel van gesteelde munisipale infrastruktuur het 'n groot impak op die munisipale begroting. Elke keer wanneer toerusting gesteel of infrastruktuur beskadig word, beteken dit dat fondse wat vir dienslewering aangewend kon word, eerder gebruik moet word om skade te herstel of toerusting te vervang.

Dit ontwig ons dienslewering ernstig en plaas uiteindelik 'n groter las op die munisipaliteit én die gemeenskap. Ek wil daarom 'n ernstige beroep op al ons inwoners doen: Help ons om ons munisipale infrastruktuur te beskerm. Meld enige diefstal, verdagte optrede of verwydering van munisipale toerusting onmiddellik aan.

Ons kan hierdie probleem nie alleen bekamp nie. Ons maak staat op gemeenskappe regoor ons munisipale gebied om saam met ons teen hierdie euwel op te tree.

THUSONG MOBILE OUTREACH BRINGS GOVERNMENT SERVICES CLOSER TO KLAARSTROOM AND LEEU-GAMKA

Prince Albert Municipality, in partnership with the Western Cape Government, various government departments and other stakeholders, successfully hosted a Thusong Mobile Outreach Programme in Klaarstroom on 22 July 2026 and in Leeu-Gamka on 23 July 2026. The outreach formed part of the Thusong Service Centre Programme, which aims to bring essential government services and information closer to communities, particularly those in rural and remote areas. The initiative provided residents with an opportunity to access multiple government services under one roof, reducing the need to travel long distances to larger towns for assistance.

A wide range of services was made available to community members during the two outreach events. These included assistance from the Department of Home Affairs with Smart ID applications and enquiries, as well as SASSA services relating to applications, screening, intake and general enquiries. Services and information from the Department of Social Development were also available to residents.

Community members also received information about agricultural programmes, housing subsidy opportunities, Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) skills development, contractor development and other infrastructure-related programmes. Legal and justice-related services, including assistance from RAF Buddies, Legal Aid and the Public Protector, were also available. Other participating stakeholders included the Government Communication and Information System (GCIS), financial service providers and representatives who provided information on land reform, rural development and Road Accident Fund-related matters.

The outreach demonstrated the importance of cooperative governance and the Batho Pele principle of putting people first. By bringing government departments and service providers directly into communities, residents were able to engage with officials, receive information and access services that may otherwise have been difficult or costly to obtain. The programme also created an important platform for direct engagement between government and communities, allowing residents to raise questions, obtain clarity on government programmes and learn about the opportunities and support available to them.

Prince Albert Municipality extends its sincere appreciation to the Western Cape Government, all participating national and provincial departments, stakeholders, community leaders and the residents of Klaarstroom and Leeu-Gamka who contributed to the success of the outreach programme.

The Municipality remains committed to supporting initiatives that improve access to government services and ensure that rural and remote communities are not left behind.

Project Updates

Klaarstroom Upgrade of Water Treatment Works



The Klaarstroom Water Treatment Works is being upgraded to improve the reliability and quality of the town's drinking water supply. The project is essential to ensure compliance with Blue Drop requirements and national drinking water quality standards.

Following a rigorous evaluation process, the tender was awarded to Master Maize (Pty) Ltd. During the initial phase, the contractor employed five local men and five local women from the Klaarstroom community to assist with clearing and preparing the site.

Benefits of LED lights:

- They use less electricity
- They are more economical in the long term
- They have a longer lifespan
- They provide clearer light
- They do not contain chemical vapour
- They are mainly made of glass and plastic, making them easier and safer to handle when they need to be disposed of
